Dear Members and Friends of St. Mary's/  
St. Patrick's, and St. Peter's Cathedral:

"And his Kingdom will have no end," is the final line of the second article of the Nicene Creed. Having affirmed the full divinity of Christ – "Light from Light, true God from true God" – the Nicene fathers made sure to finish the second article with these resounding words. Christ's Kingdom will have no end; he is the world's Lord and King forever.

It is an astonishing claim; we should never let it become a matter of routine. The King who reigns for ever is the crucified Jew, Jesus of Nazareth. And that is infinitely good news for us. The world has had and still has plenty of kings. Among them there have been just, wise and good ones, but even in the tradition of Israel the Old Testament makes it clear that there were more bad ones than good ones. Concentrations of power in the hands of flawed, sinful human beings tend to turn out badly, as we can see daily in dictatorships throughout the world. Yet human beings retain a stubborn faith that when the right one is in charge all will be well.

That stubborn hope for the strong leader who will set things right – a hope articulated by different factions about our present and previous presidents – does reflect something real. Like all human hopes and aspirations it articulates the longing for the Good, indeed for the Perfect. God has created us to long for fulfillment in him. The human tragedy is always a result of seeking fulfillment where it cannot be truly found. The longing for the perfect ruler is one of the most dangerous forms of that quest.

Our confidence in Christ our King is different from ordinary human aspirations. Jesus was by such standards a failure. It is hard to fail more extravagantly than to be brutally executed as a common criminal. Crucifixion was designed not just to kill but to torture and degrade. But God raised him up and thus showed why he was to be trusted and why the Kingdom he preached – 'not of this world' as he said to Pilate – was the true Kingdom of God. In a crucified King we can place our trust.
